- Do not keep suicidal tendencies a secret
- Don't be judgmental
- Be careful of the statement that you make
- Follow up on a regular basis
- Comfort the person with words of encouragement

MENTAL HEALTH IN NORTHERN VERMONT

This booklet is a brief guide to making informed decisions about choosing and making contact with providers of mental health and substance abuse services. There are multiple agencies and therapists who provide various aspects of care. The task of navigating this system to find a fit for your individual needs can be a bit daunting. The information presented in this booklet has been gathered by the Craftsbury Mental Health Resource Group, comprised of volunteers from the community whose goal is to increase awareness and improve access to mental health care. The guide is organized in 3 main sections: I. Crisis or Emergency of great urgency for obtaining care. II. Suggestions for how to go about seeking a professional therapist or counselor. III. A listing of therapists currently known to be in practice in Northern Vermont.

I. AN EMERGENCY or CRISIS can take many different forms.

- If you or someone you know is having thoughts of suicide, or is having thoughts of harming others, and is not able to keep themselves or others safe, **PLEASE CALL 911 or GO TO THE NEAREST HOSPITAL EMERGENCY ROOM**:
 - ♦ Copley Hospital, Morrisville (802) 888-8888
 - ♦ North Country Hospital , Newport —(802) 334-7331
 - ♦ Northeastern Vermont Regional Hospital St. Johnsbury (802)-748-8141
- Toxic overdose of drugs or alcohol can be fatal, as also can be states of withdraw from drugs and alcohol. Again, call 911 or go to a hospital emergency room NOW, Do not wait.
- It is also a crisis if you are experiencing such disturbing mental/emotional symptoms that waiting to arrange outpatient care is not possible.
- For many other types and intensity of urgency you may call a designated crisis phone number. The Regional Mental Health and Human Service agencies are staffed 24/7 to provide urgent assistance.

II. CHOOSING A THERAPIST

- Your decision to seek professional help... or not, is a big one. It is often the most important and difficult step to take. Talking with a therapist can be thought of as a "special partnership of communication."
- To begin, take a moment to craft a few words that express your concerns. Then, if you can, ask a trustworthy person for their support in pursuing this very personal challenge. (Be wary of those who offer too much advice about solutions and cures.) Your primary care doctor or nurse, if you have one, have advantage of knowing you and the providers of care in your community, and may be helpful in linking to someone that fits your needs.
- You can do some research on your own on the internet and the public library. The website for the publication
 Psychology Today, www.psychologytoday.com/therapists/vermont offers lists of therapists by location, type of
 expertise and experience, credentials, cost and acceptance of insurance, other information.
- Another avenue is by word of mouth. If you know of someone who has talked with a therapist and you are comfortable

enough to ask them, they may be able to point you in a direction that helped them or someone they know.

- Here are some questions to consider asking a perspective therapist:
 - o How long have you been practicing in your field? Are you licensed and, if not, why?
 - Have you successfully helped people with my problem and if so, can you tell me if this is an active part of your practice?
 - O What is your approach to working with clients?
 - Can you explain in laymen terms your common treatment methods, ie: talk therapy, hypnosis, 12-step and approximately how long you think we will be working together?
 - o If I need to speak to you between sessions, are you available for a check-in over the phone or email? Can I talk to you over the phone or meet with you for about 30 minutes before I commit to working with you to help me determine if it feels like a good fit? (Though some therapists may not be willing to meet face to face at no cost, some will. However, most are willing to have a conversation over the phone before setting an appointment.
 - Do you belong to any professional organizations and are you getting professional supervision? Have you had any
 malpractice claims made against you? If so for what and how did they get resolved? (You can also check with the
 state licensing board to get this information).
